

NOTICE OF WARNING

We have an investigative case report showing that you violated the North Carolina Compulsory Meat Inspection Law. This reported violation was discussed with you on June 23, 2012. Specifically, our investigation revealed that you had processed, stored, transported, offered for sale and/or sold approximately thirty-five (35) plastic bags of cooked Pork Skins, which did not contain State (NCDA) or Federal (USDA) marks of inspection or required labeling, to the general public. You stated in a signed statement dated June 23, 2012 that you offered for sale and sold the misbranded (no marks of inspection or required labeling) cooked pork skins to the general public at the Bright Leaf Market, 2320 Bright Leaf Blvd, Smithfield, NC where you operate a small sales booth.

Please be advised that the sale of misbranded and/or non-inspected meat products is a violation of North Carolina General Statute (N.C.G.S.) §106-549.23 with civil and/or criminal penalties. Please be advised that you will not receive any further warning with regard to this violation. If you should continue to sell misbranded and/or non-inspected meat products, we will pursue legal action against you to invoke the penalties associated with these continued violations. I certainly hope this expensive action will not be necessary. An officer from this department will visit you periodically to verify compliance.
