NOTICE OF WARNING

We have an investigative case report showing that you violated the North Carolina Compulsory Meat Inspection Law. This reported violation was discussed with you on March 18, 2013. Specifically, our investigation revealed that you had processed, stored, offered for sale and/or sold pork tamales wrapped in corn husks, which did not contain State (NCDA) or Federal (USDA) marks of inspection or required labeling to the general public. In a signed statement dated March 18, 2013 you stated that you purchased the pork tamales wrapped in corn husks from the Tamale Factory, Inc. located in Statham, Georgia and in turn repackaged the pork tamales wrapped in corn husks into clear zip lock type plastic bags inside your store.

Please be advised that the sale of misbranded and/or non-inspected meat products is a violation of North Carolina General Statute (N.C.G.S.) §106-549.23 with civil and/or criminal penalties. Please be advised that you will not receive any further warning with regard to this violation. If you should continue to sell misbranded and/or non-inspected meat products, we will pursue legal action against you to invoke the penalties associated with these continued violations. I certainly hope this expensive action will not be necessary. An officer from this department will visit you periodically to verify compliance.
