## On the Horizon

### Food Safety Forum on Aug. 16

The 12th Annual Commissioner's Food Safety Forum will be held Aug. 16 from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at the Expo Center at the State Fairgrounds in Raleigh.

The forum will focus on Whole Genome Sequencing technology and how using its basic foodborne pathogen identification during foodborne illness outbreaks may help reduce those outbreaks in the future. Other topics will be the sanitary transportation of food - an important step in ensuring the public has access to a safe and abundant food supply - and preparing for the implementation of the Food Safety Modernization Act through an on-farm readiness review.

The forum, sponsored by Harris Teeter and Temperature Control Solutions, is free and lunch will be provided. Participants are asked to register to ensure an accurate lunch count. ## N.C. Sentinel Landscape program announced

N.C. Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler recently announced the federal designation of 33 counties as the North Carolina Sentinel Landscape, and the development of voluntary programs of incentives for landowners and local governments that desire to participate. He was joined for the announcement at the Cherry Research Farm by leaders of North Carolina's military installations, county managers, representatives of conservation and environmental groups, and many other public and private partners.

The designation is part of a joint federal partnership between the U.S. departments of Agriculture, Interior and Defense that aims to strengthen farms, ranches and forests while conserving habitat and natural resources and protecting vital training grounds for military in-

“The best part is that it is a voluntary program that will provide opportunities for landowners and local governments at many different levels,” Troxler added. “Working and natural lands are standing guard over our military installations to allow them to do their jobs to protect our freedoms.”

## NCDA&CS offers organic certification cost-share assistance

Organic growers in North Carolina can apply for partial reimbursement of the cost of becoming certified or for recertification through a program offered by the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.

Growers who are certified or recertified between Oct. 1, 2015, and Sept. 30, 2016, can apply for assistance through the program.

“This cost-share program will cover up to 75 percent of the cost of organic certification for a

farm, up to a total of \$750,” said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. “The program has been popular, and with funds available on a first-come, first-served basis, I would encourage growers to submit their applications early.”

Under the grant, operations can be certified and reimbursed in four separate categories: crops, livestock, wild crop and handler/processor.

The program is for the 2015-2016 season and is funded

through a \$168,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Applications must be post-marked by Dec. 1.

To apply, growers must provide a completed application, along with detailed invoices/statements from the certifying agency listing all National Organic Program certified costs, proof of payment, an IRS W-9 form and a copy of your certificate or letter from your certifier if this is a new certification. All charges must be for USDA

organic certification. The application can be downloaded at [www.ncdaorganic.org](http://www.ncdaorganic.org).

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## Pest control companies penalized for violations

The N.C. Structural Pest Control Committee recently approved settlement agreements for cases in Brunswick, Burke, Randolph and Surry counties.

Following are the agreements:

-- William J. Manning, owner of Manning's Pest Control in Southport, agreed to pay \$800 for failure to supervise structural pest control work done under his license and for failure to provide adequate spill-control materials. Two technicians registered under Manning's license performed structural pest control work that resulted in a chemical spill at a residence.

-- William Hogan, an employee of Strand Chemical in Ocean Isle Beach, agreed to pay \$1,600 for using a pesticide in a manner inconsistent with its labeling, failure to properly label pesticides and not performing structural pest control work at the rate and concentration recommended on the label. Hogan did not properly trench the outside foundation of a newly constructed property in preparation for treatment. He also used only 20 gallons on the outside foundation walls instead of the 62 gallons needed. The solution was also applied in the rain and on water-saturated ground, which were against label recommendations.

-- In a related settlement, John W. Dowless, owner of Strand Chemical, agreed to pay \$800 for failure to supervise structural pest control work done under his license.

-- William Randall Baker, operating as "Bill the Bug Man" in Morganton, agreed to pay \$2,000 for performing structural pest control work without a license. Baker performed at least five unlicensed treatments and sprayed a homeowner's cats with pesticides. Baker also received a cease and desist order and was instructed to immediately stop providing services as a structural pest control company until such time he was properly licensed.

-- Earl W. Smith, a structural pest control license holder with Otho's Pest Management in Asheboro, agreed to pay \$1,200 for failing to supervise structural pest control work done under his license.

-- In a related settlement, Jeremy Ross agreed to pay \$800 for applying a pesticide in a manner inconsistent with its labeling. The total release fogger applied instructed that furniture, waxed wood floors, etc. be covered prior to use. Ross, a registered technician under Otho's Pest Management license failed to follow the label direction which resulted in damage to customer's property.

-- Rogelio "Roger" Diaz, operating under the company name Absolute Extermination, Inc. located in Mt. Airy, agreed to pay a settlement of \$3,500 for performing structural pest control work without having a license. Diaz performed structural pest control services for several homeowners and businesses while not having a valid structural pest control license.

## NCFS releases its 2016 seedling catalog

*Resource available at local Forest Service offices and online*

The N.C. Forest Service has released its 2016 seedling catalog.

"The Forest Service produces about 16 million quality seedlings for more than 50 species of conifer and hardwood trees each year at its nurseries in Goldsboro and Crossnore," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "The catalog contains information about the types of tree species, quantities and costs. Each tree description includes information about ideal planting locations and whether a species is typically used for the benefit of wildlife, restoring habitats or as marketable timber."

The Forest Service sells hardwood seedlings in quantities as low as 10 and conifers in quantities

as low as 50. Large orders also can be accommodated.

In addition, the nurseries offer a variety of Fraser fir products. "These Fraser firs come from our best family genetics, which are selected based on color, form, fullness and USDA grade," said State Forester David Lane. "They are grown in greenhouses using deep well water, eliminating the chance of Phytophthora sp. fungus. Demand for these seedlings is up, so order early."

Catalogs are available at local N.C. Forest Service offices, which are located in all 100 North Carolina counties. The catalog is also available online at [www.buynctrees.com](http://www.buynctrees.com).

Seedlings can be ordered online, by mail or by phone at 1-888-NCTREES (1-888-628-7337) using a Visa or MasterCard. To order by mail, complete an order form and send it to Seedling Coordinator, 762 Claridge Nursery Road, Goldsboro, NC 27530.

Distribution of seedlings begins in the fall, depending on weather conditions. Seedling orders are shipped to one of 13 locations statewide for a small fee, or directly to buyers via UPS, also for a fee. 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## Farm eyes growing barley for N.C. craft beer industry



With 170 breweries and brewpubs, it's fairly easy to find a craft beer made in North Carolina. However, finding a craft beer made with all North Carolina ingredients is a challenge.

Perry Farm in Wake County is hoping to make the search a little easier. The farm is one of five that have partnered with Epiphany Craft Malt in Durham to grow malting barley.

Ronnie Perry and his son-in-law Tim Kuhls harvested their first crop of barley for Epiphany in June, hoping it would work for beer production.

For Kuhls, a homebrew hobbyist, malting barley seemed a great option for a sustainable specialty crop for Perry's Farm. The Century Farm already grows wheat, tobacco and other row crops, so they already had the land and equipment, which made it easier for them to try producing barley.

Kuhls grew a 15-acre test plot of barley in 2015 and learned a great deal from the trial. Changes were made for the 2016 crop, which had its own set of challenges including hail damage, a late frost and lodging or displacement of stems or stalks from their upright position. Despite the challenges, Perry Farm averaged more than 50 bushels per acre, putting it on par with wheat.

"This has been a learning process," Kuhls said. "We're keeping it small while we are learning, but we are looking to scale up."

The education continues for Perry Farm. After sending samples to the Seed Lab in Raleigh, tests showed the crop did not have a high enough germination rate to be used in malting barley. Kuhls is not deterred by those results, and said he is already reviewing best practices and researching different varieties.

"So goes farming," Kuhls said. "We've got from now until November to figure out how to do it better."

North Carolina produces about 15,000 acres of barley. In fact, the yield was so low that the USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service stopped recording barley production estimates in 2016.

Wheat is a preferred small grain because it has been adapted to the Southeast and has higher yields than feed barley. But, the state's growing craft beer industry and operations such as Epiphany Craft (See Barley, pg. 8)

Conservation programs will be announced in the coming months, and expected sources of funding include the N.C. Agricultural Development and Farmland Preservation Trust Fund, the

Department of Defense Readiness and Environmental Protection Integration Program, the N.C. Wildlife Resources Commission, federal programs in the U.S. departments of Agriculture and Interior, the N.C. Working Lands Trust, and Food and Fuel for the Forces.

The federal partners announced the North Carolina designation earlier today, along with designations for military installations in Florida and Texas. North Carolina is the first state to have multiple military branches, military installations and counties named as part of the designation.

The counties included in the N.C. Sentinel Landscape are: Beaufort, Bertie, Camden, Carteret, Chowan, Craven, Cumberland, Currituck, Dare, Duplin, Edgecombe, Greene, Harnett, Hoke, Hyde, Johnston, Jones, Lenoir, Martin, Moore, Onslow, Pamlico, Pasquotank, Pender, Perquimans, Pitt, Richmond, Sampson, Scotland, Tyrrell, Washington, Wayne and Wilson.

In addition to the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, a number of public and private agencies and organizations have worked together for several years as the N.C. Sentinel Landscape partnership to gain this designation, including Marine Corps Installations East, N.C. Farm Bureau Federation, N.C. State University, Environmental Defense Fund, N.C. State Grange, N.C. Forestry Association, N.C. departments of Environmental Quality, Natural and Cultural Resources, Military and Veterans Affairs, and Commerce, the N.C. Foundation for Soil and Water Conservation, local soil and water conservation districts, Clean Water Management Trust Fund, Texas A&M Institute of Renewable Natural Resources and others.

## Highly pathogenic avian influenza alert

In 2015, HPAI was found in the wildfowl population in the United States, representing a risk for poultry owners. At this time no cases have been found in North Carolina.

Poultry owners are encouraged, however, to watch their birds for any signs of illness and to contact a veterinarian if they find sick birds.

Growers can also contact one of four NCDA&CS regional veterinary diagnostic labs for more information. Go to [www.ncagr.gov/vet/ncvdl/VetLabFacilitiesDirectory.html](http://www.ncagr.gov/vet/ncvdl/VetLabFacilitiesDirectory.html) for contact information.

As this disease can spread by infected wildfowl, it is important to eliminate opportunities for your birds to come in contact with wild birds.

Owners are also urged to be extra mindful of biosecurity measures to prevent the spread of this disease.

This includes quarantining any new poultry additions from your existing flock for two to three weeks to observe for signs of sickness, have a dedicated pair of shoes and clothing for working with birds that stay on your property, be mindful if driving onto property with poultry as the disease can spread by vehicles. ## State sees first case of EEE; NCDA & CS advises vaccinations

A Pitt County quarter horse was recently confirmed as having died after contracting Eastern Equine Encephalomyelitis. EEE is a mosquito-borne disease that is preventable in equine by vaccination.

The horse exhibited signs of generalized weakness, stumbling, depression and inability to stand or eat. At press time, this is the first reported case of EEE in North Carolina this

year, however two cases have already been confirmed in South Carolina.

EEE causes inflammation or swelling of the brain and spinal cord and is usually fatal. Symptoms include impaired vision, aimless wandering, head pressing, circling, inability to swallow, irregular staggering gait, paralysis, convulsions and death. Once a horse has been bitten by an infected mosquito, it may take three

to 10 days for signs of the disease to appear.

"If your horses exhibit any symptoms of EEE, contact your veterinarian immediately," said State Veterinarian Doug Meckes. "And if your horses aren't vaccinated, talk to your veterinarian about vaccinating all of your equine as soon as possible against EEE and West Nile Virus." The vaccinations initially require two shots, 30 days apart, for horses,

mules and donkeys that have no prior vaccination history. Meckes recommends a booster shot every six months in North Carolina because of the state's prolonged mosquito season.

Mosquitoes can breed in any puddle that lasts for more than four days, so removing any source of standing water can reduce the chance of exposing animals to WNV or EEE. Keeping horses in stalls at night, using insect screens

and fans and turning off lights after dusk can also help reduce exposure to mosquitoes. Insect repellants can be effective if used according to manufacturers' instructions.

People, horses and birds can become infected from a bite by a mosquito carrying the diseases, but there is no evidence horses can transmit the viruses to other horses, birds or people through direct contact.

Malt could help revitalize barley production in North Carolina.

"It doesn't make sense if it's feed, but it makes a lot of sense if it's a specialty crop," said Kuhls. "Growing one acre of high-quality malting barley is like growing two-and-half acres of quality wheat."

Sebastian Wolfrum, owner of Epiphany, has spent the past three years developing relationships with Kuhls and other local farmers.

A high-quality malting barley adapted for Southeastern climates is likely at least two years away. But, Wolfrum is already buying some barley from farmers in Chatham, Nash, Pasquotank and Wake counties. A handful of farmers also supply him with rye, wheat and other small grains for specialty malts. For Wolfrum, building relationships with farmers is important to his success.

"You can't go to an elevator house and ask for 200 tons of barley. Nobody has that amount," he said. "It's much more of a direct relationship."

That relationship is also important for Kuhls, who sees barley as a chance to diversify his crops and make sure farming continues to be a viable option for his children.

"We're committed to long-term success," Kuhls said.
