### From the tractor

I was recently in Western North Carolina touring fields and apple orchards damaged by the Easter freeze and meeting with farmers and agribusiness owners in the area. I had purposefully postponed my visit to the area until May because as a farmer I know that often the day after a disaster is not the best time to look at crop damage.

We expected to see some delayed damage to trees and plants following the extreme freeze, as well as potential recovery.

I can tell you I saw just about what I expected during my visit: Apple orchards with tiny brown, dead apple blossoms, strawberries with a far-less-than-normal amount of blooms, and high-quality nursery trees and shrubs with extensive dead areas.

I heard from several farmers about the types of damage they had experienced and the dilemma many face of trying to make something from next to nothing.

I have gone through similar situations as a farmer, and I understand both the frustration and the dogged determination to try to salvage something from a damaged crop.

More often than not, you end up pouring more money into it than you will ever see come back.

What I am afraid many people don't understand is the business aspect of farming and the relatively small profit margins for many crops. One of the keys to being successful is your ability to control your expenses.

Take, for example, the apple crop. The blooms lost on the trees will not come back this year, which means no apples. But those trees

## Troxler advises farmers to prepare now for 2007 hurricane season

With forecasts calling for a busy hurricane season, Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler reminds farmers to take necessary steps to help protect their farms if a storm strikes.

"As we've seen too many times, it only takes one major storm to ruin a farmer's year," Troxler said. "Planning is the key to reducing the potential damage from hurricanes and

tropical storms."

Hurricane season runs June 1-Nov. 30, and forecasts predict between 12 and 17 tropical storms and hurricanes in the Atlantic.

Farmers need to make preparations for their families, crews, equipment and buildings, and have backup plans for electricity for their barns and other critical farm facilities, Troxler

said. In addition, livestock operations should maintain emergency plans that address power and on-site feed needs.

Troxler said farmers should have a transfer switch properly installed so they can use a generator. A properly installed transfer switch is critical for the protection of farm facilities and utility workers, he said.

Troxler offered the follow-

ing tips for preparing farms for major storms:

- Store or secure items or equipment that might blow away;
- Identify places to relocate animals from low-lying areas;
- Check generators to be sure they are in good working order and secure a sufficient

## NCDA&CS offers assistance to farmers for GAP audits

Fruit and vegetable growers who choose to have their food safety practices verified can receive financial help from the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler announced recently.

The cost-share program will help farmers pay for third-party audits to see if their food safety practices meet federal guidelines. The goal is to increase the number of N.C. farmers who adhere to industry standards known as Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) and Good Handling Practices (GHP).

"Food safety has become an important marketing and health issue for the produce industry," Troxler said. "Buyers are demanding assurances from growers that their produce is safe. It's going to become more difficult for farmers to market their fruits and vegetables if they don't have a program in place to make sure their produce is free of contamination."

Last year, more than 200 people in the United States became sick after eating uncooked, fresh spinach from California that was tainted

with E. coli bacteria. News coverage of the outbreak severely affected sales of spinach. Verified food safety practices can help growers reduce their risks, Troxler said.

Under the program, the department will pay up to \$400 of a grower's cost for a first-time audit of the farm's food safety program. Audits can be for farm review, field harvest and field packing activities, packing house facility, storage and transportation, and traceback.

Assistance is limited to growers who undergo a GAP/GHP audit for the first time in 2007. Funding is available on a first-come, first-served basis while it lasts.

The program is funded through a grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Growers should submit an application form for the cost-share program to the NCDA&CS prior to receiving the audit. **Now is the time to take soil samples from lawns and gardens.**

Summer is the off-season for the N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services soil testing lab, and samples can be processed quickly -- usually in 10 days or less. Homeowners and landscapers are urged to submit samples at this time.

In addition, if you plan to plant a fall vegetable garden in July or August, then you need to take the first step in June. Soil test! The test is free, and sampling instructions are available online at [www.ncagr.com/agronomi/pdf/files/samhome.pdf](http://www.ncagr.com/agronomi/pdf/files/samhome.pdf). Sample boxes and information sheets are available at all county Cooperative Extension offices.

Within two weeks, you should have all the information you need to apply lime and fertilizer for a productive garden.

amount of fuel to operate them;

- Turn off the propane supply at tanks;

- Secure propane tanks in the event of flooding to prevent them from floating away;

- Move equipment to the highest open ground possible away from trees or buildings that could cause damage.

- Mark animals with an identifier so they can be easily returned if lost. Examples are ear tags with name of farm and phone numbers, brands, paint markings on hooves or coat or clipped initials in the hair.

- Move feed to higher ground or to a more accessible place in case of flooding or transportation problems.

- Coordinate with neighbors beforehand and discuss what resources can be shared.

Examples include a backhoe or set of panels.

- Keep a list of important phone numbers in order to make calls following a storm. Examples include the local emergency management office, county extension agent, insurance agent, county Farm Service Agency and private veterinarian.

- Monitor local weather reports for up-to-the-minute information on storms.

In addition, pesticide applicators should look to secure their pesticide storage areas. Applicators in low-lying areas should do whatever they can to elevate or move pesticides to higher ground.

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# Piedmont Research Station producing biofuels thanks to TTFC grant

The Piedmont Research Station in Salisbury wants to show farmers that biodiesel fuels work and work well in equipment, and that creating biofuels can be done on the farm.

Knowing that the old adage, 'Seeing is believing,' holds true for most people, station superintendent Joe Hampton thought having this technology on display at the research station made sense. Through the years, North Carolina's 18 state-operated research stations have led the way for many advances and innovations in agriculture production in the state.

"We very much want to use this as an educational tool. Our long-range plan is to put the bio-fuel system on a trailer that we can take to field days, festivals and special events, so farmers and others interested in biofuels can see what is involved in the process," Hampton said. "It's not that complicated and with the growing interest in biofuels, I felt we needed to be the ones showing this technology to growers."

Thanks to a grant from the Tobacco Trust Fund Commission, the more than 100-year-old station is turning recycled vegetable oil into biodiesel that power trucks, tractors and other farm equipment. And the five-stage process seems surprisingly easy.

Hampton first brought up the idea two years ago as a way to save the station money and as a way to help farmers become more familiar with biodiesel.

Hampton successfully pursued a grant from the trust fund and then set out to get a system up and running.

The first step was finding the right person to oversee the effort. Hampton turned to Kelly

Snider, a 10-year employee of the station who is a unit manager in charge of field crops at the station.

Snider embraced the challenge, immediately doing a lot of reading on the subject and finding out what the station would need to accomplish its goal of producing enough bio-fuel for the station's equipment and equipment at other research stations located in Western North Carolina.

Originally, the 1,054-acre station intended to purchase a complete system from a supplier, but realized after some additional study that staff could build a system with more capacity for less money.

And the rest is history.

In the summer of 2006, Snider began making and testing mini batches of biodiesel to be sure he was comfortable with the science involved in transforming the oil. Now, he routinely turns 85 gallons of recycled food oil into 75 gallons of biodiesel, at a cost of about 70 cents a gallon.

The biodiesel is blended to produce B5 and B20 for use in equipment. In essence, biodiesel replaces either 5 percent or 20 percent of the diesel fuel.

Around 30 pieces of equipment operate off a biodiesel blend, and one vehicle, a surplus military truck, runs completely on biodiesel.

Snider carefully crafts each batch of biodiesel to ensure the finished product is clean enough to power the engines. That attention to detail has paid off.

Snider keeps up with all the maintenance logs for the vehicles and equipment so he can chart any changes since switching to the biodiesel blend.

"We haven't seen fuel filters

stopping up, which we were concerned might happen more," Snider said.

Most importantly, the station has seen no difference in vehicle performance, Hampton

said.

Although the process involves basic chemistry, Snider likens it to following a recipe, a process he thinks the average person could easily learn.

The N.C. Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services operates 18 research stations across the state in partnership with N.C. State University. A biodiesel unit is planned for the Cherry Research Farm in Goldsboro, with the intent of that station providing biodiesel for other research stations in the eastern part of the state.

Hampton sees additional research efforts coming from this beginning foray into biodiesel production.

That could involve using other forms of raw materials to make biodiesel, especially if competition for waste oil increases and the station's supply dries up. It may also include finding new uses for the fuel on the farm, such as heating buildings and chicken houses.

"We need to approach it as a real person would," Hampton said. "We try to manage the resources on the station like people would who are running a business."

"We'll burn 1,000 gallons of fuel every six weeks. If we could cut our use by 20 percent, that's a substantial savings."

still must be maintained this year in order to produce in 2008.

That means spraying, pruning and maintaining the orchard – all tasks that take time and money. Many apple growers will likely be 18 months between paychecks, which makes this even more difficult.

This is a similar situation with many of the nursery crops I saw. While some plants may not be technically dead, I saw examples where the freeze killed off a good portion of plant growth that will make it unmarketable for several years. So the farmer faces a tough decision: Does he continue to maintain these plants for two or more years with no guarantee he can return the plant to marketable quality, or does he cut his losses and start with new materials because he will have more money wrapped up

in the plant than he can hope to make from it?

Jerry Merrill of Hendersonville, who with his son grows Japanese maples and other nursery plants for sale to retail outlets, finds himself in that situation. Some of his starter plants cost him \$65 and that is before he waters, feeds and cares for it for several years until it reaches market size. He suffered damage to a number of plants that were ready to be sold this season. Instead of an attractively shaped plant that may retail for \$700, he has a large plant with many dead limbs and a tiny pocket of leaf growth in the center.

In addition to the immediate damage and losses these farmers and agribusiness owners face, I also worry that the effects from this freeze will force more growers to sell their land and get out of business altogether.

We will continue to evaluate the damage across the state in the coming months. I have a trip planned to the

Sandhills region to meet with peach growers to see the damage to their trees.

I have shared with Gov. Mike Easley what I saw and heard on my visit to the mountains. Gov. Easley has requested federal crop assistance, but as of press time, none has been made available. I know it is difficult to be patient in situations like this, but I fully expect it will be some time before we see any kind of decision on whether there will be federal aid to help farmers.

In the meantime, I've encouraged growers to contact their state and U.S. representatives to make sure they understand what a hardship this freeze has created. Ultimately, the decision on disaster aid rests with our state and federal lawmakers.

I hope consumers will continue to support N.C. growers by buying locally grown commodities when available.

Tar Heel Barbecue Classic will celebrate world's best 'cue

North Carolina barbecue is the best in the world, but its two distinct styles – Eastern and Western – have made for a house divided. Until now.

The N.C. Barbecue Society and the Downtown Raleigh Alliance recently announced plans for the first Tar Heel Barbecue Classic, which will take place Oct. 6 and 7 on Fayetteville Street in Raleigh. Featuring music and activities, the festival will bring together premier barbecue cookers from across the state and attract barbecue lovers from all corners.

"We're now united in 'cue," said Agriculture Commissioner Steve Troxler. "The Tar Heel Barbecue Classic puts our state's best cookers in one place for the whole world to marvel at and enjoy."

Organizers expect tens of thousands of people to attend the event, which will stretch

from the Capitol down Fayetteville Street. "For years and years to come, the Classic will bring natives and visitors downtown to dance, see the sights and, yes, pig out," said Mayor Charles Meeker.

R.C. Hunt, president of the N.C. Pork Council, said he would like to see the event rival other barbecue competitions, such as those in Memphis, Tenn., and Kansas City, Mo.

Revelers will also get a chance to know barbecue better. The Classic will offer lessons in how to prepare and appreciate 'cue.

"North Carolina truly is 'the Cradle of 'Cue,' and as such it's only right that we bring together our best cookers to share their craft," said Jim Early, founder of the barbecue society and author of "The Best Tar Heel Barbecue: Manteo to Murphy." "There are plenty of barbecue festivals, but there will be only one Tar Heel Classic."
