
Frequently Asked Questions

1. When does the Act take effect?


January 1st, 2019.

2. How do I register?

You can register online at <u>http://www.ncagr.gov/markets/index.htm</u>.

Alternatively, you can register by downloading and printing the registration form from the website, fill out the required information by hand, and mail the application to NCDA&CS Markets Division, 1020 Mail Service Center, Raleigh NC 27699-1020.

If you are unable to use the online registration or print the registration form from the website, please contact Markets Division at (919) 707-3100.

3. Is there a cost to register?

None. Registration is free.

4. Do I need to obtain a bond?

No. Under the new Act, as amended by Session Law 2018-113, handlers are no longer required to obtain a bond.

5. What are the requirements of registration?

You are required to provide the Markets Division:

- (a) Your name or business name;
- (b) Your main business address;
- (c) The type of fruits and vegetables you handle; and
- (d) The annual volume, in dollar amount, of fruits and vegetables you handled in North Carolina.

6. What if the information I provided changes?

If your name, business name, main business address, or if the types of fruits and vegetables you handle changes, you are required to provide updated information within 60 days of the change.

For the annual volume, you are only required to update the Markets Division once a year by February 1st.

7. Will the information I provide be subject to North Carolina's Public Records Law?

No. Information collected will be held confidential and not subject to public records disclosure.
