## SHEEP AND GOAT INSPECTION PROCEDURES

## CARCASS and HEAD

- 1. Observe outer surfaces of carcass, body cavities (pelvic, abdominal, thoracic) and spleen.
- 2. Observe and palpate kidneys.
- 3. Observe and palpate the prefemoral, superficial scrotal or mammary, and popliteal lymph nodes.
- 4. Palpate back and sides of carcass.
- 5. <u>Palpate</u> prescapular lymph nodes and shoulders and lift forelegs.
- 6. Observe neck, shoulders, and head.

Note: If palpation of body lymph nodes is inadequate to determine the absence of abscesses, incise the lymph nodes. The lymph nodes should remain attached until all inspection is complete.

## **VISCERA**

- 1. Observe abdominal viscera, esophagus, mesenteric lymph nodes, and omental fat.
- 2. Observe the cut bile duct and content and express gall bladder.
- 3. Observe and <u>palpate</u> liver (both sides) and costal surfaces of lungs.
- 4. Palpate bronchial and mediastinal lymph nodes.
- 5. Observe ventral surfaces of lungs.
- 6. Observe and palpate the heart.

NOTE: The establishment should present the liver with the bile duct incised. Examine pancreatic gland for wholesomeness if the establishment saves them for edible purposes
