

Pet Waste Receptacle

Definition/Purpose

Pet waste receptacles are designed to encourage pet owners to pick up after their animals in parks, neighborhoods and apartment complexes so as to prevent waste from being transported off-site by stormwater runoff.

Policies

1. This practice should only be installed in public areas such as parks, neighborhood common areas and apartment complexes. This practice is not designed for the individual homeowner.
2. Each receptacle must include appropriate signage describing the use and purpose of the receptacle.
3. Cooperators can only receive cost share assistance on waste bags at the time of the original contract.
4. A maintenance plan is required for this practice.
5. A receptacle is made up of a bag dispenser or container and a trash can.
