Emergency Watershed Protection Program (EWP) Summary

The U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Natural Resources Conservation Service administers the Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP) program, which responds to emergencies created by natural disasters. It is not necessary for a national emergency to be declared for an area to be eligible for assistance. The program's objectives are to relieve imminent hazards to life and structures/infrastructure caused by floods, fires, windstorms, and other natural occurrences.

Potential sponsors should reach out to their local NRCS office for additional program information including templates for preparing requests for assistance to NRCS. Currently, NC NRCS is accepting requests for assistance through Jan. 31, 2025.

Sponsors Include:

A legal subdivision of the state, such as a state agency, county, city, town, soil and water conservation district, or an Indian Tribe or a Tribal organization.

For Tropical Storm Helene, NRCS received a financial assistance waiver of 100% of the construction costs for eligible emergency measures. Sponsors are prohibited from utilizing other federal funds for EWP projects. Funding is subject to Congressional approval.
