Canine Distemper Virus - Hardpad Disease

Canine distemper virus (CDV) is a highly contagious, often fatal, systemic, viral disease of dogs, for which there is no known cure. CDV outbreaks are common in animal shelters, nationwide, because of the presence of this disease in the community and wildlife reservoirs.
