

Feline Panleukopenia – Feline Distemper

Feline panleukopenia is a highly contagious, often fatal, viral disease of cats. While it has been seen sporadically in animal shelters in North Carolina, this disease, which is sometimes referred to as feline distemper, is appearing in more shelters than normal this summer (2017).
